Offensive player of the year

Brysen Hall, Wadsworth: Imagine only getting to play in half of your game every Friday night because your team is so good that it routinely wins with a running clock. That's exactly what the Grizzlies are doing. Hall has only played in 12 quarters this season yet he's 55-of-89 passing for 1,226 yards and 15 touchdowns passes and one interception. Offensive rookie of the year

Dylan Fantone, Twinsburg: Fantone led the Tigers to their first 4-0 start since 2010 before a loss last week to Wadsworth. In five games, the junior quarterback is 104-of-152 passing for 1,121 yards and 14 TDs.

Defensive player of the year

Elbert Hill, Hoban: Hill is the highest-rated defensive player from the area in quite some time, and with good reason. The USC commit has five interceptions and 22 pass breakups. He's also made 23 tackles with two going for loss.

Brydon Feister, Hoban: "Squeak" may have singlehandedly kept the Knights in the game in a 23-21 win over Detroit King, but the sophomore linebacker is more than that. He's made 46 tackles, six for loss, logged four sacks, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble. He's also registered four pass breakups.

Football coach of the first half

Jeff Fox, Nordonia: There are a lot of candidates for this one, but you have to go with Fox, who continues to find success on South Bedford Road. The Knights graduated 18 starters from a 10-3 team last season and yet they roll into Week 6 undefeated and second in Division II, Region 5. On top of that, Nordonia has scored at least 39 points in four of its five games.

Surprise team of the first half

Twinsburg: The Tigers finished 3-7 last season and lost six of their last seven games. On top of that, Twinsburg graduated star QB Joey Pollock. But at 4-1, the Tigers already have surpassed last year's win total. They have won one-point games over Aurora (in overtime) and Boardman before losing their first game last week to two-time reigning Suburban League National Conference champion Wadsworth.
