### **Akron City Series outlook**

East (6-2, 3-0) travels to Buchtel (3-5, 3-0) on Oct. 18. The winner will gain at least a share of the title. The Dragons are looking for their third consecutive league title.

# Federal League outlook

Canton McKinley (7-1, 5-0) wins the league outright with a win at Jackson (5-3, 3-1). A loss puts the Polar Bears and Hoover (7-1, 3-1) in the mix with the Bulldogs.

# **Metro Athletic Conference standings**

Norton (7-0, 5-0) can clinch at least a share of the title with a win Oct. 17 against Springfield

(1-7). If Field (2-6, 2-3) beats Streetsboro (6-2, 4-1) and the Panthers win, Norton wins the title outright.

## **North Coast Conference outlook**

Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy (7-0, 3-0) can clinch at least a share of the inaugural NCC title with a win at Padua (1-7, 0-3). Notre-Dame-Cathedral Latin (6-2, 2-1) and Lake Catholic (6-2, 2-1), who CVCA already beat, are still in the mix.

# **Principals Athletic Conference outlook**

Northwest (5-2, 4-0) can grab a share of the league title with a win Oct. 17 at Fairless (3-5, 0-4). Triway (7-1, 4-1) and Manchester (6-2, 3-1) have a shot at sharing the title.

# **Suburban League American Conference outlook**

Highland (8-0, 5-0) can win its third league title in the last four years with a win at Revere (6-1, 4-1). A Hornets win over the Minutemen and Copley loss to Barberton in Week 9 would give Highland the title outright.

A Revere win could create a three-way tie atop the league with Highland and Copley.

# **Suburban League National Conference standings**

Wadsworth (8-0, 5-0) wins at least a share of a third consecutive league title with a win over Stow (2-6, 0-5) on Oct. 17. If Nordonia (6-2, 3-2) beats Hudson (6-2, 4-1), it would give the Grizzlies the outright title.
