Breaking down Week 4 games with predictions of who will win.

A showdown of state powers highlights the Week 4 schedule.

It's Week 4 of the [Ohio high school football season](#), and it kicks off for Akron-area teams with five games on Thursday, Sept. 10.

The action really heats up with 19 games Friday, Sept. 11, including heavyweight battles between [Walsh Jesuit \(3-0\)](#) and Cleveland St. Ignatius (2-1) in Cuyahoga Falls, and [Nordonia \(3-0\)](#) traveling to [Highland](#). The weekend then finishes with two games Saturday, Sept. 12.

Who will win? Keep reading and see which teams the Beacon Journal staff thinks have the upper hand.

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Greater Akron area high school football games | Thursday, Sept. 10

Twinsburg (0-3) at Revere (2-1)

What to watch: Revere is led by Lane Shenigo, TJ Meech, twin brothers

Brady Hajdu and Carter Hajdu, older brother Davis Hajdu and Mateo Mutersbaugh. ... Shenigo ran for two touchdowns and 96 yards on nine carries last week in a 46-8 win over Parma Heights Valley Forge. Carter Hajdu contributed a rushing TD and was 7-of-12 passing for 184 yards with a TD pass to Meech, who had five catches for 166 yards. Brady Hajdu and Mutersbaugh each ran for a TD. ... Twinsburg is seeking its first win after losing 22-19 to Kent Roosevelt, 23-20 to Bedford and 24-12 to Solon. ... The Tigers feature Dylan Fantone, Kyle Anello, Kyler Hoon, Aiden Alonzo and Gavin Rathbone.

Who will win: Revere 28-21

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St. Thomas Aquinas (1-2) at North (1-2)

What to watch: North entered the win column in Week 3 with an 8-6 victory over Cleveland East Technical after losing 39-12 to Champion and 50-0 to Cuyahoga Falls the first two weeks. ... North's DJ Taylor recorded a safety last week and Jeffrey Williams ran for a 20-yard TD. ... "Jeremiah Fort led that drive [in the third quarter] with 60 rushing yards," North coach DeMonte Powell said. "He finished the game with 87 total rushing yards. The next kick return, they broke it to the 2-yard line, where Jakar Solomon caught the guy and stripped him. As the ball rolled into the end zone, freshman Shamar Randle fell on it for a touchback." ... North beat Aquinas 23-6 in the 2025 season opener. ... Aquinas lost 28-27 to Tuscarawas Central Catholic last week after winning 19-8 over Wellsville in Week 2 and losing 43-14 to Strasburg in Week 1. ... Cicero Davis, Kayden Bowman and Jaymier Jenkins are three playmakers for watch for the Knights.

Who will win: North 12-10

Aurora (1-2) at Mayfield (3-0)

What to watch: The Greenmen hope to avoid their first three-game losing streak since the start of the 2017 season, when they lost their first three but then won six of seven to make the postseason. A win won't come easily against the undefeated Wildcats, who have outscored their first three foes 129-36. ... Mayfield is scoring 43 points per game, led by the strong running of Brody Colello, whose junior season already includes turning 18 carries into 191 yards and two touchdowns at Elyria Catholic. ... Aurora is hoping to get its offense going after scoring 13 and 14 points, respectively, the past two weeks against Riverside and Tallmadge. Junior quarterback Matthew Huth and senior receiver Luke Hilditch both flashed big-play potential against the Blue Devils.

Who will win: Mayfield 31-21

Copley (3-0) at Kenston (1-2)

What to watch: This is the first meeting between the two schools, according to Fourseasonsfootball.com. ... Copley is third in Division III, Region 10. The Bombers are 14th in Division III, Region 9. ... Copley quarterback Dane Wininger (32-for-26 [assing, 519 yards, 10 TDs, two interceptions) is off to a hot start. ... Noah Slattery (13 catches, 181 yards, three TDs) has been his main target, and Jalen Owens (42 carries, 412 yards, two TDs; six catches, 122 yards, three TDs) is a versatile weapon. ... The two big names to watch for Kenston are running back Will Hamm and wide receiver Kahlil Hinton.

Who will win: Copley 28-21

Solon (2-1) at Wadsworth (3-0)

What to watch: The Grizzlies are 2-1 in the rivalry. They won 28-27 two seasons ago and 50-21 last season. ... Wadsworth is second in Division II, Region 5. Solon is ninth in Division I, Region 1. ... Brysen Hall (65-for-114 passing, 584 yards, seven TDs) and Jay'len King (23 catches, 374 yards, four TDs) continue to dominate for Wadsworth. ... Coach and former NFL

professional Antonio Hall has the Comets headed in the right direction. Solon gives up just two touchdowns a game behind three-star edge Brady Bush, who has offers from Miami (Ohio), Kent State, Buffalo and Ohio. Cornerback Khyier Robinson is the another player to watch.

Who will win: Wadsworth 35-7

Greater Akron area high school football games | Friday, Sept. 11

Cleveland St. Ignatius (2-1) at Walsh Jesuit (3-0)

What to watch: The Wildcats are 7-6 in the rivalry but lost 42-7 two seasons ago and 30-0 last season. ... The Warriors are first in Division II, Region 5. St. Ignatius is third in Division I, Region 1. ... Walsh Jesuit has beaten 2025 regional finalist Highland 34-0 and 2025 state runner-up Toledo Central Catholic 38-25 this season. It also has a forfeit win over Clark County Springfield. St. Ignatius lost 22-21 to two-time reigning state champion Avon on a two-point conversion to open the year and then beat Pickerington North 24-21 and Mentor 51-7. ... The Wildcats are led at wide receiver by Texas A&M commit Trey Haddad, Billy Cole and Jake Lamirand, with quarterback Jacob Mikin proving to be very serviceable under first-year coach Tom Kaufman. ... The defense is led by Buffalo commit James Conrad at linebacker, who has been used in a multitude of ways. ... Wide receiver Cambell Lann is expected to be back after missing the Toledo Central Catholic game for Walsh. That's welcome news for quarterback David Ternosky (19-for-30 passing, 318 yards, TD) who had a big Week 3 game. Cayden LeVert (three receptions, 94 yards) against Highland in Week 1 and Sam Barrett (seven catches, 115 yards, TD) against the TCC in Week 3 have already had productive games. ... Although Dom Courtad (39 carries, 220 yards, three TDs) is the main running back for the Warriors, Mason Rodgers (11 carries, 89 yards, TD) had a big day against the Hornets and can break one at anytime. ... Caleb Buckner had two sacks last week for Walsh, and Emmit Tobin had two sacks in Week 1.

Who will win: Walsh Jesuit 35-24

Nordonia (3-0) at Highland (2-1)

What to watch: This is first meeting of Nordonia and Highland as members of the Suburban League National Conference. ... Nordonia's offense has been unstoppable so far this season, as the Knights are scoring 45.3 points a game. ... The Knights needed all of it to fend off VASJ 41-39 in Week 3. ... QB Steven Fakult continues to put up big numbers. He went 17-of-25 passing for 284 yards and four TDs against the Vikings. ... Nordonia might have the best wide receiver corps in Northeast Ohio with Dominick Jackson, Karsen Fisher, Brock Barwidi, Collin Atha and Jamiere Davis all capable of contributing. ... After its season-opening loss to Walsh Jesuit, Highland has bounced back with two wins. The Hornets put up 55 points in Week 3 against Strongsville. ... QB Collin Wade lead the Hornets. He went 11-of-11 passing for 270 yards and three TDs against Avon Lake. Ben Radigan pulled in three catches for 128 yards and two TDs in the win.

Who will win: Nordonia 35-21

Canton Central Catholic (1-2) at Ellet (0-3)

What to watch: Ellet has dropped three straight since ending the 2025 season on a three-game winning streak. Ellet has lost 21-0 to Tallmadge, 30-20 to Field and 29-7 to Kent Roosevelt. ... Jayden Cooper is a versatile player for Ellet as a running back, receiver and linebacker. ... Canton Central Catholic beat Mogadore 19-8 in Week 2. RB Kenny Stroud ran for 116 yards on 17 carries and QB Brock Bourquin finished with 110 yards on 18 carries, including a 30-yard TD. Additionally, Bourquin threw a 34-yard TD pass to Thomas Grisez and Carter Competty had a 35-yard TD run. ... CCC lost 30-21 to Northwest in Week 3. Bourquin threw two touchdown passes (17 yards to Timothy Staub and 48 yards to Michael Bajornas), and had a 75-yard TD run late in the third quarter that pushed the Crusaders in front of Northwest.

Who will win: Canton Central Catholic 28-7

East (2-1) at Coventry (1-2)

What to watch: East and Coventry are both looking to ride the momentum from Week 3 wins, as East topped Canton South 34-7 and Coventry defeated rival Springfield 20-2. ... Lawrence Cherry Jr. and Marcus Council Jr. continue to be versatile playmakers for East, scoring two TDs apiece against Canton South. Council ran for two TDs and 148 yards on 10 carries. Cherry ran for a TD and 112 yards on eight carries, caught a TD pass from Naseer Williams-Clay and recorded an interception. ... Williams-Clay finished 9-of-13 passing for 224 yards, and had five carries for 33 yards last week. East's Emmanuel Jefferson ran for a TD and had three catches for 87 yards last week. Elijah Grice is another wide receiver to watch after totaling three catches for 105 yards. ... East's Ryan Austin had eight tackles and a sack, Chris Russell Jr. added seven tackles and a sack and Lamar Saulsberry made five tackles and a sack. ... Coventry entered the win column last week under coach Gary Kanaga as Carter Mattingly, JaCari Adams and Jace Gurganus scored TDs against Springfield. Mattingly ran for a 27-yard TD and threw a 53-yard TD pass to Adams. Gurganus had 71 rushing yards and scored on a 1-yard run. ... Coventry's defense was impressive against Springfield with big games from Ben Smith (nine tackles), Lamont Quarterman (8 tackles, two sacks), Alex Barker (six tackles, a sack), Gurganus (six tackles, a sack), Bryce Harris (five tackles, an interception), Alex Eudy (five tackles, a sack) and Mason Magoulick (an interception).

Who will win: East 35-14

Firestone (0-3) at St. Vincent-St. Mary (0-3)

What to watch: The Falcons and Irish are seeking their first win. ... Firestone is led by Kyrel El-Travis, Donniven Younger and Nae'than Milliner. Travis scored two TDs in a 33-12 loss to Lutheran East in Week 3. ... STVM features Will Adamson, Quinn Hurley and Tyler Wharton. Adamson went 15-of-19 passing for 127 yards with a TD pass to Hurley and an interception in a

54-13 loss to Hudson. Wharton returned an interception for a TD.

Who will win: STVM 21-14

Archbishop Hoban (0-3) at Lakewood St. Edward (3-0)

What to watch: St. Edward and Hoban are at opposite ends of the win-loss columns, with the Eagles undefeated and the Knights winless. ... St. Edward defeated 0-3 Olentangy Liberty 15-12, 2-1 Canton McKinley 22-8 and 0-3 Huber Heights Wayne 48-21. ... Langston Lucas is a dynamic QB for St. Edward behind an offensive line that averages 295 pounds. The Eagles roster also features Syracuse recruit BP Paulozzi at defensive end, Miami (Ohio) commit Landon Lehmer at safety, Connecticut recruit Joe Moore at tight end and Ronnie Neal Jr. at running back. ... Hoban lost 28-24 to 3-0 West Orange (Florida), 28-13 to 2-1 NFL Academy (United Kingdom) and 24-20 to 2-0 Eagle Academy (New York). ... Four of Hoban's top playmakers are RB-DB Kahlil Diming, RB-DB Jaiden Daniel, QB Israel "Major" Cribbs and WR-DB John Johnson.

Who will win: St. Edward 21-14

Brecksville (1-2) at Barberton (2-1)

What to watch: This is first time these two teams meet as members of the Suburban League American Conference. ... In year one under coach Pyrcce Taylor, Barberton has already surpassed last year's win total with last week's 35-0 win over Elyria. ... Barberton RB Cleo Thompson busted out a 60-yard TD run against the Pioneers, and QB Jack Hanlin tossed four TD passes, including a 76-yarder to Thompson and a 62-yard strike to Vernon Reynolds. ... In its two wins, Barberton has given up just six points. ... After opening the season with a win over CVCA, Brecksville has struggled on offense. ... The Bees are coming off a 26-13 loss at Berea-Midpark.

Who will win: Barberton 21-14

Kent Roosevelt (2-1) at Tallmadge (2-1)

What to watch: Two old rivals will face each other in a new conference, as both Tallmadge and Kent Roosevelt will debut in the Metro Athletic Conference. ... Tallmadge pulled off a 24-14 win at Aurora in Week 3, taking out a team against which they struggled in the Suburban League. ... Chase Waller has been solid as Tallmadge's QB. He tossed two TDs vs. Aurora, including a 78-yarder to Brenden Conley to open the game. ... Anthony Gotto has excelled at running back for Tallmadge ... Roosevelt is led by junior QB Kingston Bryant, who previously played at Twinsburg. He completed 15 of 26 passes for 126 yards and two touchdowns last week against Ellet and had three second-half touchdown passes against the Tigers in Week 1. ... Roosevelt is coached by Kardell Jackson.

Who will win: Tallmadge 28-21

North Royalton (3-0) at Hudson (3-0)

What to watch: The Explorers are 12-1 against the Bears, with their only loss a 43-35 defeat on Oct. 18, 2024. ... Hudson is second in Division I, Region 1. North Royalton is sixth in Division II, Region 2. ... Quarterback Hayden Lipinski is 38-for-53 passing for 403 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions. ... Reno Ferri is running for 6.2 yards per carry and has rushed for 317 yards on 50 carries. He has seven rushing touchdowns and has caught six passes for 72 yards with three more scores. Anthony Paolucci is Lipinski's leading receiver. He has seven catches for 124 yards but hasn't gotten into the end zone yet. ... North Royalton's 3-0 start is a vast difference from last season's 0-3 beginning. The Bears haven't won their first three games since 2012, when they finished the regular season 9-1. ... First-year coach Judd Lutz has the team moving behind quarterback Nolan Klingbeil, who has left tackle and Kent State commit Ethan Garnes and junior guard Brandon Bostick keeping him upright.

Who will win: Hudson 35-21

Stow (2-1) at Medina (0-3)

What to watch: The Bees have won five straight and are 8-3 in the rivalry. The Bulldogs' last win was 38-18 on Oct. 17, 2014, in Medina. ... The Bees are tied for 16th, and the Bulldogs are fifth in Division I, Region 1. ... Stow quarterback Gideon Larlham has turned it on the last two weeks with five touchdown passes. Running back Israel Purkiss has 287 yards and three touchdowns on 20 carries in that time. ... Quarterbacks Adam Barr (77-for-122 passing, 533 yards, four TDs) and Kaden Patrick (15-for-24 passing, 120 yards, two TDs) have been effective through the air, and Ashton Knowles (18 receptions, 200 yards, one TD) is the primary receiver.

Who will win: Stow 21-17

Cuyahoga Falls (2-1) at Cloverleaf (2-1)

What to watch: This is the first meeting between the two schools, according to Fourseasonsfootball.com. ... The Black Tigers are 10th in Division II, Region 5. The Colts are 11th in Division III, Region 10. ... Cuyahoga Falls is 2-1 for the second time in three seasons. ... Quarterback Waseem Mustafa led the way last week with 223 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 24 carries and was 7-for-16 passing for 103 yards and a TD in a 28-21 win over Southeast. Jordan Luster caught the TD pass from Mustafa, had three catches for 46 yards and recovered two fumbles, one in the end zone for a TD. ... Kellen Price came in at quarterback last week for the Colts and rushed for 159 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries in a 14-7 win over Carrollton.

Who will win: Cloverleaf 35-21

Field at Woodridge

What to watch: Woodridge opens its Metro Athletic Conference season on a roll, with a come-from-behind 20-14 win over CVCA in Week 2. ... After a seven-touchdown performance in Week 2, QB Blake Pumper came back to earth against the Royals. He went 14-of-23 passing for 185 yards, but threw

two interceptions. ... RB Jonathan Tyree continues to do everything for the Bulldogs. He ran for 53 yards and a TD, while catching three passes for 33 yards vs. CVCA. ... Field is coming off a tough 49-0 loss to Poland Seminary. The Falcons are coached by James Dutched.

Who will win: Woodridge 35-14

Norton (3-0) at Streetsboro (2-1)

What to watch: This has been the premier game in the Metro Athletic Conference for years. Either the Panthers or Rockets have won at least a share of every Metro championship since 2018, dating back to when it was the Portage Trail Conference's Metro Division. ... Both teams can be expected to lean heavily on their star running backs. Norton's Jason Beverly ran for 258 yards and three touchdowns last week against Marlinton and Streetsboro's Logan Fincham ran for three touchdowns and 150 yards in his team's victory over Alliance.

Who will win: Norton 35-28

Springfield (0-3) at Ravenna (2-1)

What to watch: The Ravens hope to shake off a peculiar loss in which they ran twice as many plays as Niles McKinley and dominated yardage 413-254 but still lost a heartbreaker. ... Mark Miller continues to be one of the stories of the season for Ravenna with two touchdowns (one rushing, one receiving) and 146 rushing yards against the Red Dragons. ... The Spartans have lost 12 in a row dating back to last year's opener. Springfield has particularly struggled to score, with 12 combined points in three games.

Who will win: Ravenna 35-7

Green (2-1) at Hoover (2-1)

What to watch: Green and Hoover open Federal League play with the Bulldogs looking to extend their winning streak to three games and the Vikings looking to bounce back from their first defeat. ... Green QB Chase

Herbert threw four TD passes and ran for a score in the Bulldogs' 42-14 rout of North Olmsted last week. Herbert has accounted for eight TDs this season (six passing and two rushing). The senior hasn't thrown an interception in 53 attempts. Aiden Rice is the Bulldogs' top receiver with eight catches for 219 yards (27.4 per grab) and two touchdowns. ... Hoover's rally from a 22-0 halftime deficit fell short in a [22-15 loss](#) to Garfield Heights last week. ... Whether healthy or injured, senior QB Nolan Bonner has been Hoover's most effective offensive weapon. A broken thumb suffered in Week 1 has prevented him from being a passer. But the 6-foot-2, 225-pound Bonner has continued as a power runner, with totals of 217 yards at 7.8 a carry and five touchdowns. Senior Michael Lammlein looks to bounce back from a 35-yard rushing night last week after eclipsing 100 yards in Hoover's wins against Buchtel and Medina. ... Senior Jayden Hall picked off two passes for Green last week. Senior LB Luke Schaal continues to be all over the field defensively for the Bulldogs. ... Hoover beat Green 27-21 last season to snap a three-game losing streak to the Bulldogs. The Vikings lead the all-time series 14-5.

Who will win: Green 20-17

Lake (2-1) at Perry (2-1)

What to watch: Lake lost a late lead on the road last week. Perry was [down 34-0](#) after three quarters last week. The bottom line is both teams look to bounce back from their first losses as they open Federal League play this week. ... Ty DeGeorge accounted for 157 of Lake's 241 offensive yards in last week's 20-16 loss at Rocky River. The versatile senior ran 18 times for 61 yards and a touchdown, caught eight passes for 48 yards and was 2-of-3 passing for 44 yards and an interception. DeGeorge has six rushing touchdowns this season. ... The Blue Streaks have allowed only 34 points through three games. Six of them came with 4:34 left last week, when Rocky River threw a 24-yard touchdown pass that ultimately decided game. ... After exploding for 369 yards and six touchdowns rushing the first two weeks, Perry senior Jonathan Lemon was limited to 68 yards on 15 carries last week.

The Panthers gained just 193 yards after averaging almost 400 yards in their two wins. ... Perry plays two quarterbacks: junior Cameron Treharn and sophomore Connor Boudrie. They combine for 24-of-36 passing for 190 yards, two TDs and one interception. ... Lake beat Perry 31-15 last year and has won five of the last six matchups. The Panthers lead the all-time series 23-16.

Who will win: Lake 21-10

Manchester (0-3) at Canton South (0-3)

What to watch: While Manchester is 0-3, it has endured two straight heartbreakers against solid opposition, losing by one point to Streetsboro in Week 2 and Columbia in Week 3. ... The Panthers were unable to get a two-point conversion in the final minute of its 32-31 loss to Columbia. ... QB Greyson Swaino went 8-of-15 for 124 yards and 3 TDs in the loss. ... Canton South is winless, as the Wildcats have struggled on offense, putting up only 1 TD in each of their first three games.

Who will win: Manchester 28-14

Northwest (3-0) at Triway (3-0)

What to watch: The featured matchup in the opening week of the PAC-7 season. ... Some see Triway as the team to beat in the conference this year. The Titans are the defending PAC-7 champions and were a regional semifinalist in 2025. ... Quarterback Jaxon Clippinger and receiver Brandt Clippinger help lead a Triway offense that scores 30 points a game. Jaxon Clippinger has thrown for 675 yards and six touchdowns. Brandt Clippinger has a team-leading 27 catches for 297 yards and TDs. ... Austin Houser and Mason Massaro are a solid one-two tandem in the Titans backfield. Houser leads the team with 291 yards rushing on 54 carries and three touchdowns ... Northwest is coming off its toughest test, a 30-21 win at Central Catholic. Coach John DeMarco's team scored the game's final two touchdowns to come from behind. ... Quarterback Brayden Venables' 58-yard touchdown pass to

Brayden Boyle last week was his first TD throw of the season. Running for almost 10 yards a carry, Venables is a threat in a Northwest running game that has rolled up 692 yards in three games. Venables and Jakob Garber have rushed for three touchdowns apiece. Connor Stephenson has two rushing TDs. ... Northwest handed Triway its only PAC-7 loss a year ago.

Who will win: Triway 24-21

Malvern (1-2) at Mogadore (2-1)

What to watch: Maddox Smith and the Wildcats had a great bounce-back performance in Week 3 against Dalton, with the senior quarterback completing 14 of 21 passes for 182 yards and a touchdown. Mogadore continues to be highly multi-faceted offensively, including Smith's ability to run and pass; Smith's multiple receiving threats, including Collin Hendrickson and Kade Thomas; and Thomas (37 carries, 224 yards, five touchdowns) emerging as a strong inside runner. ... Malvern has its own considerable offensive weapons, including 6-foot-4 quarterback Jaxon Jones and running back Luke Thomas, who scored all four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) last week for the Hornets. ... Their main challenge has come on the defensive end, as they're yielding 39 points per game. ... Mogadore scored 28 unanswered points to win last year's meeting after Malvern jumped out to a 14-0 lead.

Who will win: Mogadore 35-28

Greater Akron area high school football games | Saturday, Sept. 12

Cleveland Heights Lutheran East (1-2) at Buchtel (1-2), 1 p.m.

What to watch: Buchtel won its home opener 14-13 last week over Mentor Lake Catholic at Tim Flossie Stadium, which was renovated before this season via a \$2.5 million construction project with Beaver Constructors. Upgrades such as a new press box, a new concession building and new bathrooms are a

welcomed sight after [Buchtel received a synthetic turf field from the Cleveland Browns before the 2022 season](#). ... Buchtel QB Arthur Thomas threw two TD passes against Mentor Lake Catholic, one apiece to Trayvion Jones and Davell Tyler. The Griffins trailed 13-6 with 14 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter when Thomas connected with Tyler on a TD pass on a 3rd-and-goal play with five seconds to go. Thomas then converted a two-point conversion run to put Buchtel on top. ... Buchtel coach Bryan Williams said Thomas, Jones, Tyler and Steven Harris are playmakers on offense with linemen King Love, Mekhi Wright, Peyton Bond, Kimyata Cooper, Braylon Solomon, Nji'eem Brightwell and KenDre Carter. ... "Raseam Weems blocked a field goal against Mentor Lake Catholic, TaVione Iverson and Davell Tyler each had an interception and Mekhi Wright had a sack," Williams said. ... Lutheran East topped Firestone 33-12 last week.

Who will win: Buchtel 21-14

CVCA (1-2) vs. Garfield (0-3), 2 p.m.

What to watch: CVCA saw Woodridge rally to win in Week 3, dropping the Royals below .500 for the first time since 2024. ... The Royals will need to get their running game going against Garfield. Tommy Kopec ran for 103 yards and A TD vs. Woodridge. ... Garfield seeks its first win, having been outscored 120-25 in its first three games against Norton, Revere and Copley. ...

Garfield's Kemp Boyd will be coaching against his son, Asa Boyd, a senior linebacker at CVCA at Kenmore Stadium.

Who will win: CVCA 28-7

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
