#### Glenville rides record-setting defense to third state title

CLEVELAND, Ohio — Cincere Johnson set the tone for Glenville's defense in each of the last three football seasons.

The Tarblooders won two of its three OHSAA Division IV state championships in that time, including a historic performance this year against Shelby by holding the Whippets to 27 yards in a <u>45-7 victory</u>. No team gained fewer yards in a state championship game, regardless of division.

"We always said, 'Take them to somewhere they've never been before," Johnson said in Canton after the state championship. "That's a great team, but they haven't faced a defense, a Glenville defense with the speed and size, and somebody in the middle like myself and people in front and on the back end."

Coach Ted Ginn Sr. often agreed that Johnson had uncanny size and speed, drawing comparisons to former Glenville linebacker Arvell Reese, who is now starring at Ohio State as a potential first-round NFL Draft pick.

Johnson could soon realize that potential, too. For now, he is the two-time cleveland.com Defensive Player of the Year. Read more about him and the rest of the 2025 all-area team, which consists of a seven-county radius surrounding Cleveland, on defense below:

Collin Crocker, St. Edward

Height, weight: 6-foot-2, 230 pounds

**Year:** Senior

**About Crocker:** For the last two years, Crocker has led the Eagles (11-3) off the edge as their top sack artist. He had nine sacks this season with 25 quarterback hurries and 17 tackles for loss on the way to the Division I state semifinals. Crocker holds a scholarship offer from Ohio.

Lance Dawson, Avon

Height, weight: 6-5, 250

**Year:** Senior

**About Dawson:** A Cincinnati recruit, Dawson broke through last season amid a deep group of defensive ends during Avon's run to the Division II state championship. The Eagles (14-1) repeated as state champions this year with Dawson as their leading edge rusher. He finished with eight sacks, 35 tackles and 11 TFL. Dawson also had 36 quarterback pressures.

**About Adkins:** He can play inside or out and is headed to Ohio University. Adkins tied the single-game sack record at Strongsville (8-3) with six during a regular-season win against Medina. He finished with 44 total tackles, 19 sacks, 18 tackles for loss, three fumble recoveries and scored a defensive touchdown.

#### Linebackers

Brayton Feister, Archbishop Hoban

Height, weight: 6-3, 235

Year: Junior

**About Feister:** A 2,000-yard rusher last year, Feister took on the leading role for Hoban's defense at linebacker. He is projected to play there in college as a four-star prospect with offers that include Indiana, Michigan and Oregon. He was the Northeast Inland District nominee for Mr. Football with 102 tackles, six sacks and 32 tackles for loss during the regular season. Feister scored twice on defense and rushed for about 900 yards entering the Division II regional finals for Hoban (10-2).

#### Cincere Johnson, Glenville

Height, weight: 6-3, 225

**Year:** Senior

**About Johnson:** The reigning cleveland.com Defensive Player of the Year had 112 tackles through the regular season with 8.5 sacks and 21.5 TFL. He is headed to Ohio State and is the top-rated prospect in Ohio for the Class of 2026. Glenville (12-3) won its third state championship in four years and has made the state final four each season Johnson led the defense at middle linebacker.

## Storm Miller, Strongsville

**Height, weight:** 6-3, 220

**About Miller:** Bound for Texas A&M, Miller made a massive impact the last four years at Strongsville just like his older brother and tackle, Blake Miller, did before he went to Clemson. Storm moved from the edge to middle linebacker this season in preparation for college and made himself comfortable (offenses not so much) immediately. He finished with 110 tackles, 10 sacks and 20 TFL. Miller also had two interceptions. Miller graduates as Strongsville's all-time leader with 29 sacks.

#### Ryan Stolarski, Avon

Height, weight: 6-2, 225

Year: Senior

**About Stolarski:** A two-time state champion for the Eagles, Stolarski paced the Avon defense with 103 total tackles. Of those hits, he had 63 solo tackles, five sacks and eight TFL. Stolarski, who is headed to Miami (Ohio), also had two interceptions and seven quarterback pressures.

**About Hill:** One of the country's top cornerbacks for the last three years, Hill heads to the University of Southern California after nine interceptions during his senior season. He had one pick-six and a kickoff return for another touchdown. Hill also blocked a punt for Hoban.

#### Kei'Shjuan Telfair, Euclid

Height, weight: 6-0, 160

Year: Junior

**About Telfair:** One of the brightest spots for Euclid (4-6), Telfair is a four-star prospect with offers from Cincinnati, Clemson, Indiana, Miami, USC and Notre Dame. Those are just a few for Telfair, who doubled as a receiver. He had four interceptions, including a pick six. Telfair added 650 yards and nine touchdowns on 30 receptions.

**About Madigan:** An Army commit, Madigan has been one of Northeast Ohio's toughest players for the last four years. He was the Suburban League National Conference Offensive Player of the Year, but received All-Ohio honors for his defense. Madigan finished with 52 total tackles, 35 solo, two interceptions and three pass breakups. He rarely came off the field for coach Justin Todd, rushing for 1,108 yards and 21 touchdowns. The Grizzlies (11-1) won their third straight Suburban League title.

#### Jakob Weatherspoon, Avon

**Height, weight:** 5-10, 175

**Year:** Senior

About Weatherspoon: While Weatherspoon's season ended after nine weeks because of injury, his impact is a lasting one for the two-time Division II state champions. The North Carolina recruit moved last year from cornerback to safety and added some receiving duties to his plate. He finished this season with 43 tackles, one interception and three pass breakups. Weatherspoon also came up with a critical blocked field goal that spurred a midseason shutout of Olmsted Falls.
