Gavin Wacker has thrown for 733 yards and six touchdowns, Connor Kinser has caught 19 passes for 426 yards and three scores and reigning Loralin County League Defensive Player of the Year Trey Moore has rushed for 315 yards.

• Black River's Division VI, Regon 21 playoff hopes remain unchanged. The only realistic path is for Rootstown (8-2) to lose to Chagrin Falls (2-6) tonight along with the Pirates winning cut.

STAT PACK: Hunter Varney (333 rushing yards), Dozler Hendershot (248), Dom Bet (175) and Bryce Murray (126) have 882 of the team's 858 rushing yards. Two other players, five QB kneets and one bad snap have combined to lose 24 yards.
