PREVIEW: Winless Brookside is averaging only 10.4 points and was without talented quarterback Mason Waechter (984 passing yards, 5 TDs) last week in a 41-5 loss to Clearview. Dominick Juchnik has rushed for 307 yards and a TD this season, while five players have at

least 124 receiving yards. Juchnik and Colton Casey have returned kickoffs for touchdowns. The 13th-seeded Pirates must win out to have a 19% chance to qualify for the Division VI, Region 21 playoffs, according to fantastic50.net. The team for Pirates fans to follow is No. 10 Rootstown (at 6-1 Wickliffe, vs. 2-5 Chagrin Falls, vs. 7-0 Kirtland), which needs to

lose out for Black River to sneak in as the No. 12 seed. STAT PACK: With officially 104 rushing yards and 207 passing yards last week at Firelands, Dom Bell became the first Black River player with 100 and 200 in a game. Bell also moved his season passing total to 1,071, overtaking current coach Kyle Clark (1,041, 2002) for fifth place in school season history. Bell needs to average 244 yards over the next three games

to break the school record of 1,803 set by Eric Groesser in 2022.

• With 37 catches for 586 yards and seven touchdowns, Zane Bungard needs 11, 159 and two to break the Black Piver season records of 47, 744 and eight.

 Hunter Varney led the defense last week at Firelands with three pass breakups, including a diving stop of a fourth-down pass attempt in the final minute that secured a 40-33 victory. Mason Koberna (10 tackles), Bungard (8) and Kage Petruzzi (8) were the top tacklers, while Gabriel Negron had an early tackle for loss. Kicker Jackson Burkholder made a potential







game-saving tackle at the Black River 48-yard line on the final kickoff.

tonight.

STAT PACK: Eli Nichols saved the game last week with a fourth-down tackle for loss on the 1-yard line, extending his Medina County season lead to 15. Drew Dempsey (8), Ajay Rebraca (7), Gavin Moore (6) and Devan Horay (6) were the top tacklers, Josh Albany and Landen Kirchner broke up passes and Logan Matousek added a tackle for loss.

- Over the last three games, Nichols has 35 carries for 219 yards and two touchdowns. The senior is now 10th in Medina County with 318 yards on the season.
- . Brunswick has converted 7-of-8 fourth downs during its threegame winning streak.




PREVIEW: Roosevelt is having a decent turnaround season and boasts a spread offense averaging 30.4 points that is built around quarterback Gavin Peeps, who has completed 118-of-188 passes for 1,694 yards, 17 touchdowns and four interceptions while also rushing 54 times for 406 yards and eight scores. Tyler Ellington is the No. 1 target wit catches for 504 yards and four scores, while Ka'Shan Talbert (63 carries, 349 yards, 3 TDs) and Makhi Jones (54, 216, 4) have split time at running back.

STAT PACK: Casey Myser needs five total touchdowns to break the Medina County career record of 82 set by Black River's Andrew Vaughn (2010-13) and five rushing touchdowns to break Vaughn's 72. Myser is still a ways from Vaughn's scoring record, however, as Vaughn's 19

- two-point conversions give him a 530-468 points edge.

 Nick Dobkowski's five interceptions are tied for eighth most in school season history. Mike Mostoller set the record of nine in 1990.
- Highland's 16-game regular-season winning streak is the longest in school history, but the Hornets also had a 16-0-1 stretch from 1968-69.
- The Hornets lead Medina County with 47 tackles for loss and 11 interceptions despite playing one fewer game than the six other

Quarterback Steven Fakult (1,942 passing yards, 17 TDs, 2 INTs) is the centerpiece, Dominick Jackson (28 catches, 635 yards, 8 TDs), Grant Kaminski (24, 430, 3) and Collin Atha (27, 382, 2) are the top receivers and Connor Whapham (98 carries, 558 yards, 6 TDs) is the leading rusher.

 Wadsworth must win out to clinch the coveted second seed in the Division II, Region 6 playoffs behind Highland (6-0), which is a massive favorite to win out and clinch the top spot. In the OHSAA's new 12-team format, the higher seed hosts through the regional semifinals.

STAT PACK: Jacob Earnest led the defense last week at Hudson with 10 tackles (2 for loss).
