Ohio high school football's Top 10 Summit County offensive linemen to watch



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You can't move the ball without [the big men up front](#).

Greater Akron has some solid pieces on the offensive line once again in [high school football](#).

Here are the top 10 from the area heading into the season.

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1. Caleb Williams

Hoban, tackle, 6-4, 290, Class of 2027

[Williams](#) was a key piece to an offense that gained 292.2 yards per game, with 189.0 of that coming on the ground. He has offers from Akron, Ohio University, Austin Peay, Youngstown State, Kent State, Marshall, Sacred Heart, Fordham, Buffalo and Ball State.

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2. Owen Pelkowski

Walsh Jesuit, tackle, 6-foot-5, 280 pounds, Class of 2027

[Pelkowski](#) anchored an offense that averaged 369.2 yards, including 242.5 yards on the ground. He committed to Akron in June over the Kent State, Miami (Ohio), Illinois State and Cornell.

3. Otto Grill

Hudson, tackle, 6-7, 285, Class of 2028

[Grill](#) committed to Ohio University in July over Kent State, Yale, Air Force, Dartmouth and others. The Explorers averaged 299.8 yards last season, with 155.7 of that coming on the ground.

4. Josiah Neumeyer

CVCA, 6-0, 240, Class of 2027

[Neumeyer](#) was part of an offensive line that guided the Royals to their first state semifinal in school history. CVCA averaged 375.9 yards, with 300.7 of that coming on the ground. He was Division II honorable mention All-Ohio last season.

5. Rylee Pickering

Hoban, center, 6-0, 285, Class of 2027

[Pickering](#) was a key piece to an offense that gained 292.2 yards per game, with 189.0 of that on the ground. He has offers from Findlay University and Wheeling.

6. Anderson Tetzl

Wadsworth, tackle, 6-3, 275, Class of 2027

[Anderson](#) was out last season when the offense averaged 434.6 yards, including

217.9 yards on the ground. He has an offer from Ashland and interest from Kent State and Valparaiso.

7. Calvin Brunson

Walsh Jesuit, tackle, 6-5, 315, Class of 2030

[Brunson](#) hasn't even played a down for the Warriors and the gigantic freshman already has offers from Kent State and Miami (Ohio).

8. Spencer Marquis

Highland, center, 6-1, 220, Class of 2027

[Marquis](#) was part of an offense that averaged 402.9 yards, with 238.8 yards of those on the ground. Running back Casey Myser set school records for points (552), total touchdowns (92) and rushing TDs (80) while finishing third in rushing yards (4,847) behind Marquis.

9. Niko Enberg

Copley, tackle, 6-5, 270, Class of 2027

Enberg was part of an offense that piled up 354.1 yards per game, with 178.0 coming on the ground. He has offers from Findlay, Butler and Walsh and interest from Ball State, Western Michigan and Kent State.

10. Blaze Johnson

Manchester, tackle, 6-1, 250, Class of 2027

Johnson excels at causing havoc on the edge of the offensive line for Manchester. He was named to the All-Northeast Inland District first team and was named to the PAC-7 first team last year for the second consecutive season.

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
